



On the first day back for Term 3 we celebrated St Anthony's Feast Day. For lunch we were treated to a delicious pie. Everyone enjoyed playing with their friends again after the holidays.

For the first activity, we did circus skills which was led by Maddie. There were hula hoops, spinning plates, poi socks and flower sticks. We also did balancing on each other at the end. Our favourite thing was balancing and flower sticks.

For the second activity we made juggling balls filled with rice. We filled a freezer plastic bag with rice, and then we wrapped them until they were a neat bag. Then we got two balloons and cut the necks off them, then we wrapped the balloons over the bag of rice to add some colour to the bags. In the end some of us made one, two, even three or four!

After that we (tried) to juggle the balls we recently made and it was so much fun even though some of us couldn't do it that well. In the end it was a tonne of fun trying to juggle the balls and everyone enjoyed it.

Our first activity of the day was making juggling balls out of rice, balloons and plastic bags. We made them by taking half a cup of rice and putting it into a plastic bag, then twisting the bag and folding it over again and again until there was none left to fold over and it resembled a ball shape. From there, we got two balloons to put over the rice ball. To do this, we cut off the bottom of each balloon and used the top part to wrap over the rice ball. Everyone then had the choice to add as many balloons as they wanted.

After we had finished putting the balloons on, we used the bottom of a balloon to cover the ball and make sure no rice would fall out.

Then we watched a video showing how to juggle. After the video, we tried doing it ourselves by first throwing one ball up, then two juggling balls crossing over. Once you perfected that skill, we moved on to throwing three juggling balls in the air.

We all had fun doing that for a while until it was time to move on to the next activity.

For our second activity, we went to the Future Design room to create paper acrobats and make them flip on a string and cut straw we were given.

First, we got a paper outline of a person to decorate and colour. We used lots of colours and patterns and added a face and hair. We decorated both the front and the back to give it an illusion like it was 3D when it flipped.

Once we were ready to stick it onto the straw, we got a piece of string and put it through the straw using a stick to help us. We then stuck the person to the straw, and when we moved the straw, the person moved too.

These acrobats were really fun to make and they all looked really good!

Our third activity was making eye masks in the art room.

Everyone got a mask, a piece of string, and a clown nose to work with. On the eye mask, the people in Martin's group would draw a design on their own eye mask with textas and pencils. When they were done drawing, they would tie the string through the holes in the mask to actually make it wearable. Now the clown nose – we got a red clown nose for fun to wear. We could either wear it with the mask or just on its own. If you were done with your mask, you could do free drawing on a piece of paper, or the teacher in our art room would print something off for you.

Our last activity for the day was circus activities. There were various stations, including devil sticks, poi, hula hoops, and spinning plates. We were split into four groups and rotated around until we had done all of them.

In the devil sticks activity, we had one long stick with strings at the ends and two smaller sticks. We made an "H" shape with the sticks – the smaller ones on the sides and the big one in the middle. Then we used the smaller sticks to throw and catch the big one. We could flip it, spin it, and try many cool tricks.

Then there were the hula hoops. With these, we could swing them around our legs, waist, neck, and arms.

Another activity was called poi. These are long stretchy socks with balls stuffed inside the ends. We swung them around and did a trick called "The Butterfly." It's called that because it looks like two flapping butterfly wings.

Finally, there were the spinning plates. We balanced special plastic plates on long sticks and spun them. Some people stepped outside their comfort zone and did harder tricks, like throwing the plate onto the stick and landing it.

Once we finished all the rotations, we had a bonus activity of human balancing. We made a big crowd formation with people standing on and leaning on each other. And that concluded our circus activities.



# "Bringing Faith and Learning to Life"

Dear students, families and staff,

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS): Monday 1 September – Friday 19 September 2025

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through **MACSSIS**, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys.

MACSSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic schools in Melbourne by the Learning Services team at MACS, in partnership with researchers at Learning First and in wide consultation with principals in our schools.

In 2025, students, families and staff are invited to participate in MACSSIS via our secure and purpose-built online platform. The online platform is where our school leaders will access the summary reports that visualise the results of the student, family and staff surveys.

The MACSSIS survey platform is operated by an independent supplier, ORIMA Research Pty Ltd. The platform meets with the high security and privacy standards for handling student and school data. Participating schools are in the process of updating their privacy policy to ensure school communities are fully informed and protected.

Students in years 3-6, will be provided with supervised sessions, where teachers are on hand to help and answer any questions. Families and staff can complete the survey anytime over the three-week window via an emailed link and password. Feedback has indicated that previous surveys were completed across a range of mobile devices and different web browsers.

Our community's opinions are critical to understanding how our school is performing – MACSSIS is a key data source for guiding the ongoing work to improve our school.
