






Leigh Hobbs Webinar


NAN'S GARDEN



Explicit Teaching at St Anthony's

At St Anthony's through our Explicit Teaching approach we are incorporating Daily Review at the beginning of our Literacy and Mathematics sessions. Daily Review is a high-impact teaching strategy that is based on evidence and practices derived from the Science of Learning.

Daily Review Principles

- Start of every lesson: takes place at the beginning of each lesson
- Spaced & interleaved practice: designed for the retrieval of previously taught content
- Involves all students: all students participate using consistent full participation routines
- **Teacher led:** time is used efficiently, and answers can be checked easily for feedback
- **Short duration:** approximately 10 15 min
- Fast paced: faster pace than the lesson, crucial for maintaining student engagement
- **Desirable difficulty:** balance the motivating effect of success with the need for challenging retrieval.

Why daily review?

- Daily review is all about **retrieval**.
- Consolidation of information **from short-term to long-term memory**, making it easier to recall later.
- Active recall during reviews forces learners to **retrieve information**, strengthening neural connections and **reinforcing memory**.
- Daily reviews lower the **cognitive load**, making it easier to process and retain information.
